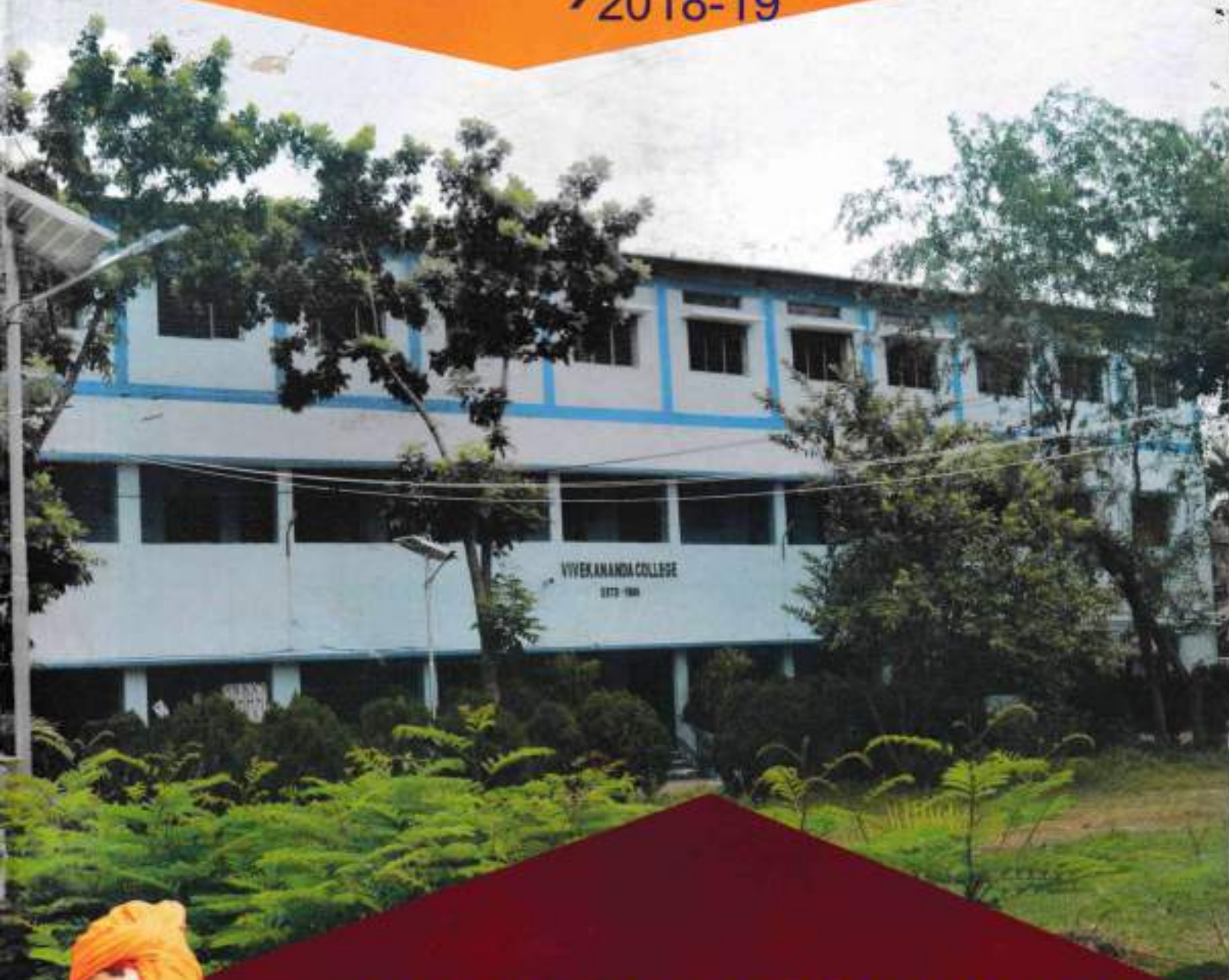

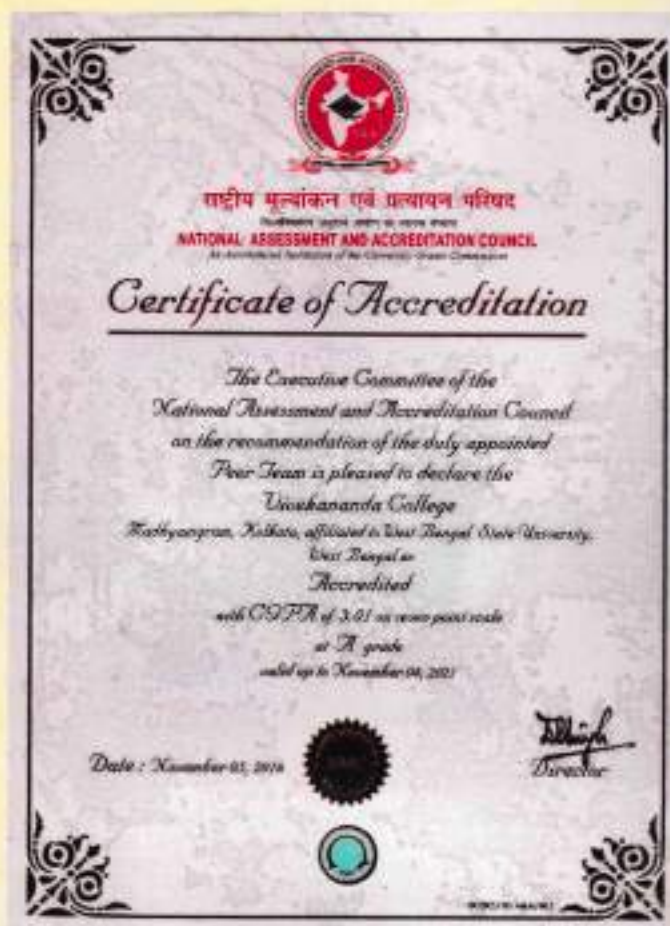

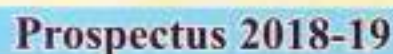




NAAC Accredited Certificate

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Principal's Desk



Vivekananda College MADHYAMGRAM is a thirty year old institution of higher learning formerly affiliated to the University of Calcutta since inception in 1986 and then subsequently to the West Bengal State University from 2008. The aim of the college is to impart quality education taking into consideration the social, economic, political and administrative challenges. The story of the progress of the college is characterized by ruthless striving and sleepless determination to overcome all obstacles that reared their ugly hideous heads on its journey to excellence. The road was rough; the terrain tough but there was no dearth of zeal and enthusiasm. Everyone had a dream which was to make the college reach the heights of excellence, inclusiveness and sincerity in its service to the community.

VISION:

The College has the vision of raising the Institution to a very high standard in respect of teaching, learning, results, administration and academic atmosphere in the college campus, so that it becomes one of the premier institutions of the country.

MISSION:

The name of 'VIVEKANANDA COLLEGE' is chosen to pay our homage to Swami Vivekananda, the great Patriot and social reformer and eternal embodiment of the soul of India and a great inspiring force behind the making of modern India Swami Vivekananda who firmly

believed that education was the manifestation of the perfection in man. Vivekananda college Madhyamgram borrows its inspiration from the golden thoughts of Swamijee who remains to this day the beacon light of our destiny, hopes, aspirations. We have, in keeping with the strength and conviction of such time tested truths, set audacious goals.

SHORT PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE:

The college being adjacent to the Jessore Road and not far from the Madhyamgram Municipality seemed to be a boon for the inhabitants of the area as there was no college in the vicinity and gaining admission in elite colleges was indeed tough for students hailing from semi urban and rural background. The simple people of our locality needed an institution where they could send their wards to seek true education without the trammels of opulence weighing them down, a college where teaching was honest and above all bereft of the ostentation of arrogant scholarship. These men were poor but they had abundant reserves of determination, strength of mind and shared a singleness of purpose, qualities without which the foundations of such an enduring edifice might not have been possible. In 2002, Dr. Chandan Kumar Chakraborty joined the college as Principal and the narrative of the college after this period is one of hope, ambition and development. Within months of his assumption of office honours courses in Bengali, Education, Geography, History and English etc, were introduced. Since 2002 the college has been definitely growing in stature. The layout of the present building with augmented spaces in the library, canteen, hostel for women, new classrooms, boundary wall along with completion of 2nd Campus Boundary wall, construction of the 2nd campus building, inauguration of Seminar cum conference room and cycle garage etc ushered in a new era in the college. The college now proudly boasts of having its own deep tube well, three Generators, Smart Class rooms, Virtual class room, 26 fire extinguishers, 32 CCTVs, 11,000 books at Library, bar-coded books, INFLIBNET and N-LIST Programmes for 1,00,000 lac e-books and 6000 e-journals, online carrier counselling system, Gymnasium for Ladies etc. The college has introduced regular P.G. courses in Geography from the academic session 2017-18. This is in addition to Distance Education P.G. courses in Geography, Bengali, History, English, Pol. Science, Sanskrit





from DDE, Vidyasagar University and in Bengali, History, Education & Geography from DDE, Rabindra Bharati University. Further from the current academic session the college authority proposes to introduce regular P.G. courses in Bengali, History and Education for which the college has already undergone a rigorous screening process by the officials of the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal. The college has also taken positive steps to introduce regular Honours courses in Computer Science, Journalism & Mass Communication, Mathematics, Physics, Political Science and Philosophy from the current academic session [2018-19].

Very few colleges in the vicinity can boast of having 45 Computers, 4 Laptops, 24 A.C. Machines, three Projectors, one Total station, five cold drinking water Machines, Women's Hostel etc. With the active co-operation of the president of the Governing Body Shri Rathin Ghosh the college authority was able to purchase 3 bighas of Land for construction of the 2nd Campus building and work on the construction of 4-storied new building started in right



earnest. The college has 8 Solar Lights system, Rain water Harvesting, Medicinal Plantation, Concrete Path way, Beautiful small play ground, beautiful garden and Computer Training Centre, organized by Webel Technology Limited (A Govt. of West Bengal Undertaking). We have introduced Science stream at U.G level from the session 2017-18. The success rate of last five years (both Hons & General students) are above 92% and our students have always maintained the one to tenth Ranking position in the university from respective subjects each and every year. Under the Principal's leadership, the minority community are much more interested to get admission in this College. This college is one of the few colleges with a large proportion of minority community

students. The college boasts of 56% minority boys & female students most of whom have produced wonderful results at the undergraduate level and have also in some instances excelled in university examinations at the Post Graduate level. The active intervention of the college administration has ensured that minority students receive financial assistance from the UGC, Govt of West Bengal and also at the College level. Steps were taken towards the beautification of the campus, provisions for enabling students to reap the benefits of the digital era were made and new classrooms were constructed. As a direct corollary there was a marked increase in student strength and there are SC/ST and OBC A and B and Minority students on its rolls. Special classes are held and tutorial level guidance is provided for the academically deficient. There is also the provision of arranging stipends for all students irrespective of their backgrounds. There is the scheme of Remedial Coaching Classes and the Entry - in -Service Scheme has instilled confidence in students to explore the job market.

In conclusion, it should be mentioned that the Teaching faculties, Non-teaching Staff and also Students are actively involved to maintain the calm and quiet atmosphere in the College campus. Our institution was awarded by the NAAC (1st cycle) as 'A' Grade Institution on & from 5th November, 2016.

In its 22nd annual survey of the best educational institutes of India the magazine INDIA TODAY in its special issue dated 4th June, 2018 ranked our college at the 2nd position in West Bengal in both Arts and Science streams. Besides, the all India ranking of our college is 50th in the Science stream and 59th in the Arts stream. This is another feather in the cap and no mean achievement coming close on the heels of the golden approval received by NAAC in 2016.

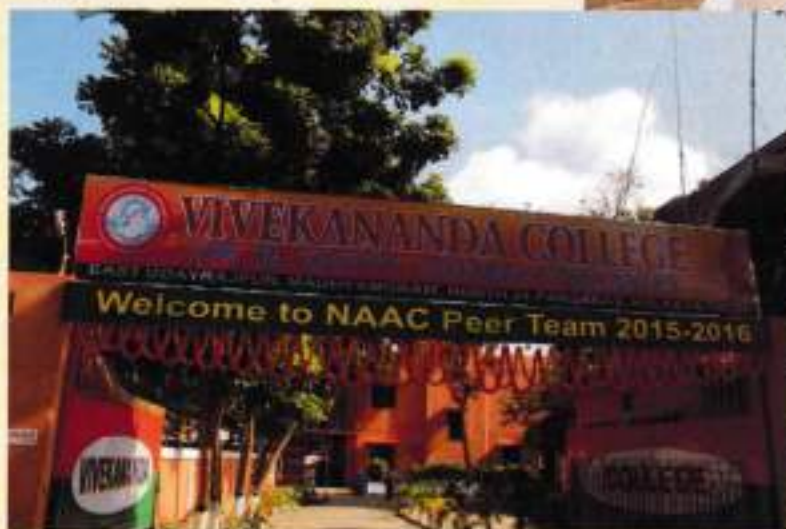
HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Vivekananda College, Madhyamgram was established in 1986. It is named Vivekananda College to pay our homage to Swami Vivekananda, the great patriot and social reformer, and eternal embodiment of the soul of India and a great inspiring force behind the making of modern India.

Our college is a co- educational day general degree college affiliated to the West Bengal State University. It is situated in a calm and quiet atmosphere and is far from markets, stations, cinema halls and other disturbing factors. At the same time it is within the locality where all modern amenities are available. It stands on the eastern side of the Jessore Road, National High Way No-34, about 1km from either Madhyamgram or Hridaypur railway station on Sealdah-Bongaon section. It is about 18 km away from Calcutta and is connected with the city, the capital of West Bengal both by bus routes and train services.

The college has now its own building (two storied) & women's hostel, canteen for student & staff surrounded by boundary walls. General courses in Arts and Honours courses in English, Bengali, History, Geography and Education are taught here besides General courses in Science Stream, namely Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geography and B.A. General Courses in Journalism and Mass Communication will be taught from this current academic session (2017-2018). Further, the College introduced the new regular M.Sc course in Geography from the session 2017-2018. But behind this achievement there is a history – a history of struggle, a history of dedication and sacrifice of some good souls of our locality.

Former Minister Sri Saral Deb became the First President of the Governing Body of the College. It was primarily due to



his active participation in formulation of Government policy in matters pertaining to higher education and wholehearted support extended by ministers like Sri Sambhu Ghosh and Sri Nirmal Bose that the college was finally established in 1986. However, after a period of 25 years Sri Rathin Ghosh, Chairman, of the Madhyamgram Municipality was unanimously elected President of the College Governing Body in January 2012. It is hoped that under the able leadership of Sri Ghosh the College will achieve holistic progress by dint of his administrative acumen and erudite



promptness in execution of all academic activities and development works.

Sri Ganga Sankar Chatterjee became the first Principal of the college. Dr. Chandan Kumar Chakraborty is the present principal of the college. He joined the college on 11th April 2002. Dr. Chakraborty has been taking interest for the development of the college. It is because of his endeavour that honours courses have been opened in the college. Construction work of the 1st floor and 2nd floor building and the construction work of the boundary walls of the college, separate students union rooms, cycle stand, women toilet, women's



hostel, water supply, canteen for student & staff, air conditioned library room, geography practical room, principal's room, teachers' room, office room, cooling water supply, smart class room, digital library system, projector machines, virtual class room & so on have all been done during his period. During the tenure of service of Dr. Chakraborty, Sri Satyasadhan Chakraborty, Honourable Minister-In-Charge of Higher Education visited the college and the Honourable Minister expressed his good wishes for the college.

Further, Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge of Higher

Education, Govt. of West Bengal inaugurated our 2nd Campus at Kirtipur, North 24 Parganas on 5th January 2016. In this regard, the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal sanctioned an amount of Rs. 22 Lakhs for constructing the Boundary wall at 2nd campus, Kirtipur, North 24 Parganas.

In this connection it is to be noted that Sri Debabrata Biswas M.P sanctioned Rs 5 lakhs for construction of the new building of the college and Rs 8.33 lakhs for construction of the boundary walls of the college from M.P. LAD Fund. The Zilla Parishad, North 24 Paraganas has also sanctioned Rs 5 lakhs for construction of the 1st floor building (extension) Further Sri Debabrata Biswas has sanctioned Rs 10 lakhs for construction of new building.

Again U.G.C has sanctioned Rs. 70 lakhs for construction of the womens' hostel in the college campass. The construction of the building is completed. The U.G.C. team led by Prof. D. S. Rathore (Chairperson) has praised the initiative of the principal Dr. Chandan Kumar Chakrobrorty in this regard.

A representative team of The Director of Public Instruction, Department of Higher Education Government of West Bengal visited the college under the scheme "Performance-cum-Need based Incentive Scheme" in February 2012 and after witnessing the rapid progress of the college and impressed by the zeal and industry of all stake holders immediately sanctioned an amount of Rs. 9.5 lakhs for academic development of the college. Further, the Higher Education Department, Govt. Of West Bengal also sanctioned an amount of Rs. 43 lacs for constructing the 2nd floor for Seminar Hall, Class Room and Library Room. Further, the State Govt. also sanctioned an amount of Rs. 5 lacs for purchasing Books, Furniture and Equipments. Further, Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal sanctioned amounting to Rs.3 Lakhs for arranging virtual class room. It was noted that this was possible due to the constant efforts of the principal in his regular interface and communication with the state government, The U.G.C. and the people of the locality.



It is a known fact that any educational institution becomes great and renowned by the qualities, attainments and character of its students, teachers and the non teaching staffs and not by its buildings and the number of subjects taught. But it is believed that by the joint effort of the employees ,the students and the G.B. the college will be able to develop constructive and nationalistic attitudes and positive values of life in the mind of the students of the college.

Further, accreditation by NAAC: The college initiated the process of under going assessment and accreditation by NAAC Peer Team by sending Self-Study Report on 30th December 2015 for 1st cycle & NAAC Peer Team visited the college for assessment on and from 26th September 2016 to 28th September 2016 and highly appreciated various activities of the college in its academic quality, administrative

How to Get Admission for the Session 2018 – 2019

The students and their guardians are advised to get admission through online process through the website. Our college website is: www.vivekanandacollegecms.com The following Instructions should be followed strictly:

1. Log in to the website: www.vivekanandacollegecms.com. Click on the Online Admission Column. Then, Fill up the form as per instructions properly. Then preview the form & submit the form.
2. You will pay the online payment through Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net banking facility. Also, You will receive print out of the submitted online payment documents or receipt.
3. After successful submission of the form online you will get auto generated application number. Further, application number must be saved for future reference.
4. Online application payment receipt will be in Two parts. One part is Candidate Copy & other is the College Copy.
5. A candidate may apply for 3 (Three) subjects.
6. After depositing the online payment and getting a print out of the online receipt copy the candidate must show it to the college for receiving the Prospectus.
7. Admission will go on as per the merit list which will be put upon the college website.
8. After publication of merit list enlisted students will deposit the admission fee through online system through Credit Card / Debit Card or Net Banking system.
9. Online admission payment receipt will be in two parts. One part is Candidate Copy & other is the College Copy.
10. Selection will be strictly on the basis of Merit.
11. After the admission of students testimonials & documents will be checked & verified by the College authority through online process.
12. No subject change will be allowed after admission to particular course or subjects.
13. At the time of verification if any dispute relating to candidate's documents arises his / her admission will be cancelled. The results of fake boards (as per list published by the WBSU) will be cancelled if any candidate admitted to the college portal.
14. University registration will be made at the time of admission.

8. Original School leaving Certificate.
9. All Xerox copy should be self attested.

Migrating Students

Students from other University or Board may be provisionally admitted. their provisional admission is liable to be cancelled if they fail to submit the necessary documents required by the University. They are-

- a) Permission to migrate from the original University or Board
- b) Pass Certificate for examination at which he/she appeared last.
- c) In case the pass certificate is not available, the original Marksheet and the Admit Card will have to be submitted. Admission may be refused to an applicant without any reason being assigned.



Transfer

A ward once admitted to this college will not ordinarily be allowed to take transfer to any other institution except at the end of an academic year. Students seeking transfer in the middle of the session are required to pay all the Annual charges (including annual session charges) in full in addition to the Transfer Fee.

In case of Hons. the transfer fee is Rs. 500 and in case of General course the transfer fee is Rs. 300.

Code of Conduct

Students are required to follow strictly the rules and regulations of the college

- a) Students are to treat the members of the staff with courtesy and respect. Misbehaviour with teachers and staff is a serious offence and may lead to the expulsion of the offender
- b) Students should help the concerned employees to keep the college clean.
- c) Students must maintain silence in the classroom, corridors and examination halls
- d) Any breach of discipline in the class room or examination hall will make the students liable to punishment.
- e) Total silence should be observed in the library
- f) Students are to maintain discipline inside and outside the college. Smoking in the college premises is strictly prohibited
- g) Any discourtesy towards the girl students shall be severely punished. It may even lead to expulsion from the college.
- h) Students should make a habit to look up to the Notice Board arriving at and while leaving the college. No excuse will be considered if the notice on the Board are ignored.
- i) Disturbing the class and yelling out at any students from the class during the class hour is a serious offence.
- j) Outsiders are not permitted within the college premises and students should not bring outsiders to the college
- k) Every Student must carry their ID Card in the college campus.

Attendance in College

- ★ Regarding attendance, the students who have secured percentage below 60% will not be allowed to fill-up the form for appearing B.A., B.Sc., (Both Hons. & General) Sem-I Examination or be promoted to Sem-II.
- ★ Students who have secured percentage from 90% to above 90% will obtain 5 marks, from 80% to 90% of attendance, students will obtain 4 marks, from 75% to 80% of attendance, students will obtain 3 marks, from 70% to 75% of attendance, students will obtain 2 marks and from 60% to 70% of attendance, students will obtain 1 mark.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

MEANING OF NSS:

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Department of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year, 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at 10+2 level working for a campus-community linkage.

AIMS OF NSS:

The programme aims to inculcate social welfare in students, and to provide service to society without bias. NSS volunteers work to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity. In doing so, volunteers learn from people in villages how to lead a good life despite a scarcity of resources. It also provides help in natural and man-made disasters by providing food, clothing and first aid to the disaster victims.

NSS IN OUR COLLEGE:

LIBRARY AND LIBRARY RULES

The library of Vivekananda College has emerged to its prominence by introducing modern amenities students, teachers & scholars. It boasts of digitization, Wi-fi zone and Infflibnet & Bar coded system. Through Infflibnet users can get access to 1 lakh books and Six thousand Journals of its past ten years.

- ★ The library remains open daily on working days from 10am to 5pm. Books are issued on presentation of requisition slips on all working days except Saturday between 11am to 2pm.
- ★ Every student will be provided with a library card at the beginning of the session which will entitle him/her to take out books from the library. The card is not transferable and has to be returned within a fortnight before the student sits for his/her final examination, or when the students take transfer. In case of loss, a fresh card will be issued on payment of a fee of Rs 20/- (Twenty) only.
- ★ Only one book will be issued to a student at a time and can be retained by him/her upto 15days. Re-issue is permissible provided the books are not needed by other students or not in short supply for the reading room. Reference books may not be taken out of the library reading room.
- ★ Books must be returned before or on the due dates, failing which a fine of Re 1/- will be charged for each book for each day of the default. If the fine accumulates up to Rs10/- or more, the students will not be allowed to take out any more books till the fine has been paid and the Library- official has granted him/her permission to use the Library.
- ★ If the book is lost it must be replaced or should pay the market price.
- ★ The borrower shall have to check as to whether the book issued to him/her is littered damaged or moth eaten at the time of issue. No complaint in this regard shall be considered thereafter.
- ★ Talking, sleeping, smoking and loitering within the library are strictly prohibited.

Infflibnet: Information and Library Network centre is an autonomous Inter-University Centre of the University Grants Com, mission of India. The institution is delighted to inform that the computerization and networking of the College Library has been undertaken under the INFLIBNET programme of the UGC. The library has its own local Network connected with a server with terminals inside the library. In addition the college provides access to nearly 100000 online books and 6000 electronic journals of previous ten years to its users in all the campus under the UGC-INFLIBNET

Career and Counselling

Career & Counseling Cell/Placement Cell in College

The College provides career & counseling/placement cell through online system for getting job. The scheme of establishing a career & counselling cell/placement cell in the College has been formulated to address the diverse socio-economic challenges and Geographic backgrounds of the heterogeneous population of students coming to the Colleges vis-à-vis equity of access and placement opportunities through availability of appropriate institutional support information. Linguistic differences and cultural gaps among students also call for the setting up of placement cells. Availability of relevant and accessible information coupled with professional guidance towards students to utilize the same can result in better career achievement outside the class rooms and help in the healthy progression of students for getting job after completion of their courses.

Functions of Career & Counselling Cell/Placement Cell

- To gather information on job avenues and placements in different institutions and concerns related to the courses that the College offers through online system.
- To analyse information in the local, regional and national context to explore its relevance and utility for the students in their placements and on-job training.
- To organize Seminars and Guidance workshops for informing students about the emerging professional trends and events, job profiles, leadership rolls, entrepreneurship, market needs and risks and implementation of national socio-economic policies and to impart training in soft skills.
- To promote discipline, healthy outlook and positive attitude towards national integration and removal of narrow provincial preferences and prejudices.
- The college provides campus interview by various organisation viz Government undertaking Institution and various corporate organisations.

Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC(Non-creamy Layer) and Minorities

The College provides Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) & Minorities students of the College under the financial assistance of University Grants Commission. In order to enable students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minorities communities who need remedial coaching to come up to the level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently and to reduce their failure and drop-out rate, the UGC will provide financial assistance for conducting special classes outside the regular time table during the 12th Plan. Students belonging to other backward classes and general candidates may also be allowed the benefit of such coaching classes. A nominal fee (not exceeding the monthly tuition fee) may be charged from the general candidates. However, physically challenged students and students who are general candidates coming from families with income below the poverty line (as guided by the state/UT/Central Government) will be exempted from paying the fee.

Coaching Classes for Entry in Services for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy Layer) and Minorities

The College provides Coaching Classes for Entry in services for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) & Minorities students of the College. The well being and development of the SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) & Minorities are important indicators of the strength and success of a democratic society. Specific provisions have been made to improve the status of these groups, socially and educationally, so that they can take their rightful place in society. Representation of the groups in all India/State and Provincial services and equivalent positions in the private sector is an indicator of how far the country has been successful to equip them so that they are in a position to safeguard their own interests.

In order to prepare students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minority communities to get gainful employment in central and other services mentioned above, the UGC will continue the scheme of Coaching classes for entry in services for SC/ST/OBC and Minorities during the 12th Five Year Plan. Applications may be sought by advertising in a local daily so as to cover students outside the college rolls. Coaching may be organized by dividing the candidates into groups of not more than 25 students.



Online Competitive Examination Training Centre

Facility for digitalized career & counselling system i.e. students will be able to avail online career & counselling system for appearing in competitive examination. In this regard students will get MCQ questions and answers through online system for preparing themselves for appearing various competitive examinations.

Computer Training Centre (WEBEL)

Vivekananda College in collaboration with Webel Technology Ltd. (Govt. of West Bengal Undertaking) has introduced Computer Literacy and Training Programme for the College students. It is called a Career Oriented Certified Computer Course.

Course Duration: Two Years (Stage - I & Stage - II), Classes will commence from the new academic Session 2017-2018. The course fee is Rs.1,200/- (Rupees one thousand two hundred) only per year. The course would be treated as optional.



Campus Placement

The college arranges campus interview for the students every year, being offered by the Government (Undertaking) and corporate institutions on regular basis in different period of time.

Free Internet and Wi-Fi Services

The college provides free internet and Wi-Fi facilities to the students and teachers in order to mobilize the academic curricula, given by UGC.

Smart Classroom



The College has a modern smart classroom for the students in the premises. The teachers deliver their lectures through the utilization of smart classroom.

Virtual Classroom

The College has a modern virtual classroom for the students in the premises. The teachers deliver their lectures through the utilization of this virtual classroom.



Digital Seminar cum Conference Hall

The college takes pride in having a modernized seminar hall Vivekananda Hall to organize seminar, conference and guidance workshops for informing students about this emerging academic trend. Department related films and documentaries are also shown in this hall.



Medical Service

There is a provision for treatment of the ailing students through the students Health Home. Students can get medical facilities and specialized Treatment in lieu of an annual subscription of Rs 15/- (fifteen) only per student.

Women's Hostel



The facility of Women's Hostel is available in the College for the Existing Regular Girl Students. The Girl Students who want to avail this facility are requested to apply to the College Office for Fooding & Lodging Purpose within the College Campus, for the session 2018-19

Multi-Gym Centre



The college has a flourished multi-Gym centre in the premises. The students can easily avail multi-Gym facilities as per the instruction given by the Gym-Instructor.



Cafeteria

The College has a well-furnished cafeteria in the campus. Foods are available in the campus at a very concessional rate. The students should follow the rules and regulations of the canteen management.

Pure Drinking Water Service

The college is very serious to provide pure drinking water through deep tube-well and Blue star cooling water supply machine.

Second Campus of Vivekananda College

The institution also added another feather in its cap by introducing Second Campus at Kirtipur, North 24 Parganas (beside Nabin Chandra High School). The land of the 2nd Campus was registered on 31.12.2015 under the able guidance of Principal, Dr. Chandan Kumar Chakraborty and Sri Rathin Ghosh, President of the Governing Body. The campus was inaugurated by Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Minister-in-Charge of Department of Education on 05.01.2016. The construction of the Second Campus is going on in full swing. The Boundary wall of the Second Campus is already completed through the financial assistance of Rs.22 Lakhs from the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal. The Plan and Estimate of second campus building is under process by the P.W. (Dte.), Social Sector, Barasat, North 24 Parganas, Govt. of West Bengal.
